NSPCC



In December, children will be participating in the NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe programme.

Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children aged 6-7 and 9-11. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. If you would like to know more about the *Speak out. A heartfelt message from a local composer, Ric Haworth, regarding the release of his new song, 'The Light' (feat. DRIVE) supporting the charity [BAGS \(bagsforstrife.co.uk\)](http://bagsforstrife.co.uk) which was set up by people who have lost loved ones to suicide -

'Whilst you're having a morning brew, break at work, lunch, tea or chill time today / tonight...please can I ask you to download our full version of 'The Light' (feat. DRIVE) ... our new song, written by myself and 3 amazing Mums (Angela, Jen and Kathleen) who all lost their young ones after they took their own lives.

The song is currently available on most platforms and will be added to others over the next few days.

We are asking people if they can go to the download section and physically download the song instead of streaming...this will help in so many ways for the charity and to get the song more attention ...thank you so much for all of your support and we are looking forward to sharing the next stage of the songs release which will be coming soon x'

A little about the song...

The Light, is a powerful song crafted with the aim of raising awareness about the pressing issue of suicide among young people on a national scale. This heartfelt and emotionally charged composition reflects the inner turmoil and isolation experienced by those contemplating taking their own lives, addressing the darkness that individuals find themselves in and the light, support and hope that they can find from family, friends and others.

Through poignant verses and a moving chorus, **The Light**, encourages open conversations and a call to action. This strives to ignite a sense of unity and responsibility, urging listeners to be vigilant, reach out to those in need and create a safety net for young people who may be battling with suicidal thoughts.

Ultimately, **The Light** is a heartfelt musical plea to bring this national crisis to the forefront of our collective thoughts and inspire a movement of compassion and intervention to save young lives.

Books

Cold Weather

Please remember to send children in with waterproof winter coats everyday, and hats and gloves as the weather turns cold. If your child needs to use lip balm due to dry skin in the cold weather, this is permitted before school and at break times, not during lessons. Please remind your child that lip balm is not to be shared. Labelling of lip balms in case they get lost will help with a swift return. Absence and Lateness



The School day begins at 8:55am. Gates are opened ten minutes earlier at 8.45am when children are welcomed in by a leader at the gate. After gates have shut at 8:55am, we frequently have a number of children arriving after school has officially begun. When children arrive late they are missing out on morning learning opportunities. Please ensure that your child is on time every day.

If you do arrive late with your child, you need to accompany them to the front office and sign them in on the touch screen 'inventory' system.

Please do everything you can to avoid taking children out of school as this comes at a cost to your child's education. Please see our attendance policy on the website for information regarding penalty notices which will be issued if a pupil has had 5 school days (10 sessions) lost to unauthorised absence during the current term or 7 school days (14 sessions) in 2 consecutive terms. A holiday form must also be completed at least **2 weeks prior** to the start of the absence to avoid a penalty notice being issued.

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



We have had a lovely week in Lower Key Stage 2. The children have continued to work really hard in all of their learning. In Science we have learnt more about the human body, this time concentrating on muscles and their functions. In RE we were reflecting on the Trinity and how being a Christian helps us to live our lives in a positive way.
