# **Weekly Highlights**

## **Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds**



This week, Little Lennies have been exploring the planet we live on - Earth. They have been using GoogleEarth to see what it looks like from outer space. They have been on an adventure with Aliens in underpants as they started to think about what might be beyond the planet we live on - what might be in space and how you might get there!

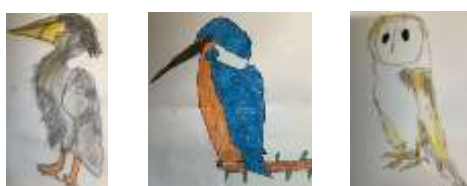
Blackbirds have been on an adventure with QPootle5 - his spaceship landed on Earth and needed fixing! Blackbirds have been exploring planets - What are they? Is Earth the only planet? They have been exploring how far away from Earth each planet is, how each planet orbits the sun and looking closely at the moon and what it is made of. Blackbirds have asked curious questions and have their own individual ideas about what scientists may find in outer space in the future! Blackbirds also led our Church worship on Friday morning for Mothering Sunday and what a fabulous job they all did - we are so proud of each and every one.

## **Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons**



We have had another very busy week in Key Stage 1! World Book Day was great fun. We enjoyed exploring the book 'Our Tower' and wrote some lovely descriptions of our own homes. We also enjoyed creating our own version of the tree-grown man using different materials. In geography, we continued to explore hot and cold countries and started to locate them on a world map and think about how the weather changes around the world. In RE, we listened to the second part of the Easter story and used a game of pass the parcel to help us sequence events from the story. Our science learning involved using our observation skills to describe bulbs and seeds and we thought carefully about what plants need to survive. Our week ended with us enjoying a game of football and listening to some amazing stories to help us celebrate International Women's Day. Well done everyone!

## **Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls**



It's been a fabulous week with the children thoroughly enjoying World Book Day lessons and activities. They

created a piece of writing and wonderful artworks based around the fantastical adventure, Our Tower by Joseh Coelho and Richard Johnson. We were also impressed by the children's efforts to create a Book in a Box for our Book Day Competition. We also celebrated International Women's Day by taking part in the biggest football event #letgirlsplay with all children involved in playing football in their year groups. In RE we considered the times of trust and betrayal within the Easter Story and we discussed why the day that Jesus was crucified is known as Good Friday and its meaning for Christians. In Science, we asked the question, 'How do leaves make food for plants' and discussed the meaning of photosynthesis. We made connections between the interdependence of animals and plants in terms of the intake and excretion of oxygen and carbon dioxide. Great work LKS2!

### **Year 5**

This week has been a busy one in Year 5! In RE, we studied Matthew's gospel and considered our personal questions about the death and resurrection of Jesus. In Spanish, we were challenged to order the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears without any English translations! World Book Day on Thursday was a day enjoyed by all - what's not to love about coming to school in your pyjamas and getting stuck into a good book?! We also spent time rehearsing for our brass concert next week, which is sounding brilliant. We look forward to welcoming you next week to watch the children's performance.

### **Year 6**

This week year 6 have really enjoyed World Book Day - the children created some super writing and artwork based on the book 'Our Tower' and looked very comfy in their pyjamas whilst doing it ! In science, the children have finished their work on the circulatory system and created a presentation based on all of their learning across the unit. In geography, we learned about the different types of tectonic plates and the effect that they have on the Earth's surface as they move. In writing, the children have been writing their non chronological report on the Galapagos islands. IN RE the children learned more about Jesus and how he was seen by other people. What a busy and productive week !
