

# St Leonard's Approach to World Religions



At St Leonard's we take seriously the teaching of faith and the impact it has on the lives of believers. This is true not only of the Christian faith but of those of other faiths. It is essential that our pupils experience being accepting and understanding to those with faith and those with none. We believe hat all people in the society they experience, and are yet to experience, are equal, and have a right to their own choices and their own expression of belief. It is through this that we embody our Christian values and British values, to love one another as Christ has loved us and indeed to walk in the footsteps of Jesus Christ. It is through this approach to our curriculum that we have a carefully considered plan of teaching.

Considering our locality, community and those with whom we have contact, we have deliberately chosen to educate the pupils about and to learn from Judaism, Islam, Sikhism and Hinduism.

#### Judaism

As a Christian school we teach Jewish beliefs and practices so that children gain a greater understanding of the character of God to His people, the traditions of the Torah and to reflect the community we have within travelling distance from our school. We feel it is very important that our pupils recognise that Judaism, as a distinct religion in its own right, underpins and forms the basis of the Christian Faith. With so much in common and with Jesus Himself being a Jew, we feel this is a fundamental part of our RE teaching at St Leonard's. Our aim is that children will have a firm understanding and appreciation of Judaism, developing each time they encounter it in their yearly allotted unit of study. In EYFS pupils are introduced to Judaism through the topic of prayer, in KS1 pupils develop their breadth of understanding in the units they cover, in KS2 pupils develop a depth of understanding:

#### **EYFS**

Pupils learn about Judaism by being introduced to the faith in the context of prayer, enabling pupils to understand the impact of faith on the lives of believers. This is visited in both Nursery and Reception to consolidate this understanding at the outset of their RE learning.

EYFS 10: Prayer – What is prayer?

### KS1

Pupils learn about the Jewish Faith by being introduced to the Torah, the synagogue, and a Jewish Festival – Sukkot. Through all encounters, pupils are constantly reminded to question how the Jewish faith impacts the life of a Jew.

Through all encounters, pupils are constantly reminded to question how the Jewish faith impacts the life of a Jew.

# <u>Islam</u>

As a Church school we actively promote the love and understanding of all, therefore we choose to engage with and reflect our local community by developing the pupils' understanding of Islam. Many pupils in our school follow Islamic beliefs and, as such, we prioritise the teaching of Islam to promote learning, understanding and respect. To ensure a developing understanding, pupils encounter different aspects of Islam from EYFS to Y6 enabling pupils to gain a breadth of knowledge of Islam and a healthy attitude of respect to those who live a life of submission to the Muslim faith in our locality and beyond.

# **EYFS**

By doing so, we promote a position of love and understanding of those in our wider community and a developing understanding and knowledge of World Faiths. We believe that these particular two World Faiths are especially appropriate at our church school, given that they firstly bring an insight for our pupils into an Eastern Worldview that is so different to our own, and secondly that by definition, they are very different to the Christian Faith. This is especially true for Hinduism with its colourful and wonderful approach to its own distinct approach to theism.
