Nativity Performances - at St. Leonard's Church

The children are so excited to be able to share the Nativity story with you next week. They have been working so hard and we are very proud of all their efforts. A huge thank you to the staff who have worked so hard on these performances too. It is a great opportunity to pause and reflect in the busyness of December.

We are limiting numbers in the church to allow for more social distancing thus to help prevent the spread of Covid-19. **Each child is allocated two places per performance,** which will be checked off against a class list on arrival at Church. There are **no tickets** to bring to reduce the handling of items.

Early Years (Little Lennies and Reception Blackbirds class)

Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and Year 2 Doves, Eagles, Falcons)

Wednesday 15th December 2021 2:30pm and 5:30pm

After the 2:30pm performances, your child/ren can be collected from church. They will go home in their costumes.

For the 5:30pm performances, please drop your child/ren off at school at the main entrance between 5:00pm and 5:10pm, wearing their costumes.

To help prevent the spread of Covid-19 we ask that you kindly follow these arrangements...

- 1) Complete a lateral flow test before coming to the performance.
- 2) Wear a face covering when inside the Church.
- 3) Sanitise hands upon entry and exit.
- 4) Sit with your family group and try to maintain some spacing between family groups.
- 5) Do not come into the church if you have any symptoms of Coronavirus.

KS2 Pantomime Performance on Tuesday

Years 3-6 will be attending the Pantomime Aladdin on Tuesday morning. They will be leaving at 9am. Please ensure that your child is at school on time. All children in Years 3-6 should wear their **full school uniform on Tuesday** (not PE kits). They will be provided with a small snack and a drink to enjoy during the interval and will be back at school for a slightly later lunch.

EU Settlement Scheme

Check what you need to do to stay in the UK if you or your family are from the EU, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland. https://www.gov.uk/eusettledstatus

Extra Funding for School (Pupil Premium Grant)

All Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are entitled to Universal Free School Meals irrespective of household income, however, if you in receipt of any of the following benefits, school can receive extra funding called Pupil Premium Grant – currently £1345 per year. Even if you would prefer your child to eat packed lunches, if you think your child (in any year group) could be eligible for Free School Meals, we would be extremely grateful if you could please register via this link https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals so that school can then be in receipt of extra Pupil Premium grant funding.

Eligibility criteria Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

COVID-19 Update

If your child has symptoms of COVID-19, (high temperature, new continuous cough or loss of taste/smell) please don't send them to school and and **get a PCR test.** They should return to school immediately if they test negative. If the test is positive, self-isolation at home is required for 10 days and other household members need to have a PCR. Siblings who have tested negative should then attend school as normal.

NHS Test and trace are now responsible for informing about close contacts. Should your child be advised by Test and Trace to take a PCR test due to being a close contact or someone else who has tested positive for COVID-19, they must still attend school whilst waiting for their result if they are asymptomatic.

Close contacts will not be required to isolate if they fall into the following categories:

Close contacts or household members of a positive case are exempt from self-isolating if any of the following applies:

- They're fully vaccinated
- They're below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- They've taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- They're not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Staff in school continue to help to reduce the spread of Coronavirus within school, by adhering to the following control measures as part of our risk assessment and as advised by the DfE.

- Ensuring good hygiene for everyone
- -Maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes.
- -Keeping occupied spaces well ventilated.
- -Following public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.

Schools are required to have an 'Outbreak management/contingency plan' to outline how operational systems and processes may change in response to positive cases reaching a certain threshold considered to be an 'outbreak'. Parents and carers will of course be kept updated should any restrictive measures need to be temporarily put back in place at school.

Communication with school – procedures for parents/carers to follow

Please remember that teachers and school leaders may not see nor be able to respond to direct emails due to the nature of their work, and **therefore there may be a delay in resolving an issue**, especially if there is a need for leaders and teachers to forward emails on to the most appropriate person to deal with enquiries. We would really appreciate your patience and understanding with this, and your trust that your enquiries are not being ignored if there is a delay in response. We **always** do our best to get back to messages as quickly as possible.
