

The Heron Class children have started Spring Term in an inquisitive way. In PSHE we asked, 'What are families like?' and considered diversity of family units. In RE we asked how Jesus did, and continues to change lives. We made connections by thinking about dramatic changes that we have experienced and thought about stories from the Bible where Jesus affected people in a dramatic way. In Geography, we also questioned the needs of early settlers in Britain and what resources they would have needed when setting up a village. We considered why certain places were chosen for settlements and discovered how some of our place names originate from these early settlers. Additionally, the children enjoyed their music lesson and practiced listening and responding to beats and rhythms.

The children identified different types of families and created their own definition of a family, thinking about what makes theirs special and unique. 


Owls

The children enjoyed learning about Victoria Falls as part of our new geography project and used their map skills to describe the location of the falls. In art the children produced some wonderful silhouettes of the London skyline during the Blitz to complete their World War Two art for our 'When the Sky falls' display. We have started to learn about the Exodus story and the importance of significant events to the world. A super week of learning - well done Wrens class!
