# Christmas Lunch 2022!




We will be holding our Christmas Lunch on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December (that's our Christmas jumper day too!)


## Cold weather and severe weather planning

## **Weekly Highlights**

#### Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





The children really did put on a great performance in our Nativity at the start of the week! Fantastic singing and actions from all and such clear voices from the children with speaking parts. We could not have been any prouder! The Christmas Story and The Christmas Promise have been the books that we have shared this week. Little Lennies have been listening to and joining in with the actions in the story and they have helped to make a story map to retell the story. They have enjoyed making Nativity scenes and other Christmas crafts by using scissors to snip or cut. In the hall they have used mats, benches and boxes to act out Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem, they had to climb over, through and around things. In Maths they have compared lengths of tinsel, some were longer than others and some were shorter than others. Pattern hunting on Christmas crackers has also featured in this week's learning.

In Blackbirds, we have some interior designers for the future! The children have helped to change and restyle some of our play spaces. They have enjoyed retelling the Christmas story in our role play stable and in our small world area. We have looked at the characters in the story and talked about how they might feel. The children then thought about how they feel in different situations. The new book corner has been very popular with the children, they have enjoyed sharing some of the books that Father Christmas gave us last week. In Phonics we have been reading longer sentences that have had several tricky words in them. 1 more and 1 less has been our Maths learning this week.

#### Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







We have enjoyed another fantastic week of learning in Key Stage 1 with lots of exciting learning in all three classes. This week we have all worked extra hard in completing our assessments and wowing the teachers with our efforts. It has been fun learning actions to our Christmas Nativity songs and practising it all together in the church. Our highlight this week was definitely the magical pantomime full of singing, dancing, acrobats and rain!

#### Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







What an incredible week we have all had! In English, we have started to plan and write a story opening based on 'One Christmas Wish'; the children are definitely getting in the Christmas spirit. In DT, we have built and added the finishing touches to our pavilions. They are looking fantastic. This week in Science, we investigated how shadows are formed and how the distance from a light source impacts the size of a shadow. Our super Year 3 and 4 scientists used lots of complex vocabulary to explain their findings to each other. In History, we summarised our learning so far, focusing on the achievements of the Ancient Egyptians. The children were then very excited to learn about time capsules and create one firstly, as if they were an Egyptian, and then for someone in the future to find out all about life in 2022. We also enjoyed a wonderful morning at the pantomime; what a great week! Well done, everybody!

#### Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts & Wrens







#### Year 5

A fantastic week in Year 5! We have finished our class novel, *When the Sky Falls*, and can all say we really enjoyed reading this book. On Monday, we practised our fire-building skills in the Woodlands and toasted bread over the fire, as well as making shortbread biscuits in the kitchen with Mrs Skilling - they smelled delicious! We completed our science unit, learning about the history of astronomy and how scientists' understanding of space evolved from a geocentric model of the solar system to a heliocentric model. In history, we compared what we can learn from different Anglo-Saxon texts including the Lindisfarne Gospels, Bede's History and *Beowulf*. We loved our brass lesson, learned how Navidad is celebrated around the world in our Spanish lesson, and started to consider how to make motorised doodlers in DT. This week's highlight was the fantastic Cinderella Pantomime in Blackpool and the teachers were very proud of our behaviour out of school. One amazing week to go!

#### Year 6

Wrens have had a lovely week in school and have enjoyed a variety of exciting activities. In Science the children researched how stars are formed and learned about various constellations and in History we learned about 'Operation Overlord' and the strategic events that happened as part of the D-day landings. The children enjoyed their trip to the pantomime (Oh yes they did!) and were impeccably behaved - we were very proud of them once again. Our week has finished with a trip to Blackburn Cathedral where we enjoyed singing carols at the lunchtime carol concert. Well done everyone - a fabulous week!
