


Vision Screening in Lancashire

Little Lennies

We are now taking bookings for children to start Little Lennie's Pre-School from **September 2024**.

If you have a child who was born between 1st September 21 to 31st August 22, they will be eligible to start pre-school 2024/2025.

Government advice can be found below regarding free childcare. Please contact the school office for further information regarding places and additional hours. Spaces are filling up quickly!

15 hours free childcare for 3 and 4-year-olds

All 3 to 4-year-olds in England can get 570 free hours per year. It's usually taken as 15 hours a week for 38 weeks of the year, but you can choose to take fewer hours over more weeks, for example.

Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



This week our early years children have been thinking about lost things! In Little Lennie's our Nursery children have learnt from the story of the lost coin. They went to church to hunt for lost coins and reenact parts of the story and they have been using their observational skills to notice the differences between different coins.

The children have also created some coin repeating patterns. They have talked about how each one of us are different and how special this is. In Reception, our Blackbirds children have read the story of the lost sheep. They have discussed ways in which we can keep ourselves safe from getting lost - linking our thoughts to our Pupil Promise number one. We learnt about the words people use when herding sheep using sheepdogs. This week has also been a very musical week - we began the week moving to beats and rhythms, moved onto played the Glockenspeils and ended our week with our first Ocarina lesson! Such fun as always with lots of new knowledge. Well done everyone! ①

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







What a busy week we've had in KS1, with lots of super learning! This week we have been learning how to draw different emotions and expressions on faces in Art. In Geography we spent time looking at vegetables and fruit grown on farms, and the way in which they grow. Our PE has been continuing with dance, moving like animals in time with the beat. In Science we have been looking at the usefulness of different materials. We have been enjoying learning more about dragons in our new English book - we made 'Beware of the dragons' posters with super sentences! Well done everyone.

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



In LKS2 this week we collected noun phrases and prepositions, which we grouped into themes. We then used them to write descriptive opening paragraphs for our historical narrative based on Escape from Pompeii. In Science, the children predicted and identified conductors of electricity, complete and incomplete electrical circuits. In Geography we continued making informative posters for the water cycle and writing the journey of a raindrop. Our artists learned and practised printing skills using various objects for printing techniques, and then created their own stamps. In PE, we travelled from a Wild West theme to Thriller, creating a sequence of moves with a focus on rhythm and beat. In RE we continued to ask the question, How did Jesus show his power and authority? We looked at Biblical events show that Jesus is the Son of God and linked to the Sabbeth. Finally, in PSHE the children identified, What is a community? They named buildings and places shared by our community, identified groups that exist in the community and how they may be linked to each other.

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts & Wrens



Year 5

Year 5 enjoyed finishing Macbeth and discussing its themes. They continued their dancing in PE, moving from last week's Harry Potter theme tune to Ghostbusters. In RE, they continued their quest to discover why Christians believe Jesus was a great teacher, looking particularly at 'The Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard.' Science saw a move from investigating thermal insulators (what will keep the ice cold?) to electrical conductors (what will make the brightest bulb?). Swimming was popular, as always (no products, please) and brass lessons are now working towards a concert on 30th March. Geography's focus on changes in human geography (how people use the land) moved from regeneration for the London 2012 Olympics to before and after the Coventry Blitz of WW2. With
