Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





This week in Early Years our Little Lennie's children have been learning through the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt.' The children have been very creative and have made binoculars and a story map, showing the journey the characters took in the book. The children have made sea and beach scenes and used our real woods to go on their very own bear hunt - focusing upon counting and how many bears they could find! In Blackbirds class, our Reception children have read the story of 'Where's my Teddy?' They have used the outdoor classroom to hunt for rhyming words and think about rhyming strings. They have used natural pieces to create artwork inspired by Andy Goldsworthy. The mapwork the children completed, developed their writing skills as they labelled parts of their maps and understood their meaning. During circle time, we have thought about different emotions as well as develop our vocabulary linked to sizes and ordering. Another very busy and happy week - well done everyone!

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







What a busy week of learning we have had in all three classes in KS1 this week. In English the children are continuing to enjoy our class book 'The Dragon Machine', thinking carefully about locations where dragons could live and designing their own machines. The children have worked so hard in Art, applying paint without brushes to explore texture for effect. We labelled maps of the UK in Geography and learnt all about the different foods that we get from each part of the country. The children are so good at programming the bee-bots now in their computing lesson! In Science the children have been using Venn diagrams to sort different materials according to their properties. Well done KS1 on all your hard work this week.

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







This week, Herons, Kingfisher and Owls children have been practising a variety of verb forms when writing a letter of advice to characters from the text "Escape from Pompeii". They have described what they would have seen, heard and felt when Mount Vesuvius began to erupt in August AD79. The children are enthusiastically engaged with the text which also provided opportunities for using and punctuating direct speech to show dialogue and relationships between characters. Additionally, LKS2 teachers have enjoyed the children's independent use of similies and personification, to add interest to their description. In Maths the children have been consolidating methods of multiplication and division by learning effective strategies and when to apply them. We have continued to explore electrical circuits in Science and the children were challenged to make a switch that can be used to turn on and off a bulb in a series circuit. The children drew on strengths of curiosity, perseverance and determination. Great work! Linking to our Egyptian studies, in the last History unit of work, and continuing with 'Rivers' and the water cycle in Geography, we considered, 'How and where do people use and change rivers?' with a focus on the River Nile both historically and in present times.

What a super interesting week!

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts & Wrens







Year 5

Year Five continued their spooky dance, branching out a bit more into the zombie theme to follow along with some of the steps to the music, Thriller. In RE, they looked at the parables of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast, followed by the parables of the Hidden Treasure and the Pearl, considering their meanings and how they have an impact on people. Our trip to Jodrell Bank was packed full of information about the stars and planets, with children showing good knowledge or asking thoughtful questions. It was a little longer than expected but well done to everyone who made the most of it. In Spanish, children continued by moving on from describing places in town to giving directions. Friday afternoon saw some children doing their science work on soluble and insoluble materials while others practised some important punctuation and grammar skills on Learning by Questions.

Year 6

This week has been another week of hard work and fun in Wrens class. We have come to the end of our 'Selfish Giant' writing unit and the children have produced some excellent narratives based on the story. The children worked on sustainability in Geography and thought about ways they could save resources. In RE, the children learned more about Jesus as a teacher and produced some super letters explaining about Jesus' work. The children have worked hard in Art and this week have painted their fabulous sketches. They have also enjoyed PE and because they worked so hard completing assessment papers, enjoyed an extra hour of PE this week. Well done Wrens – I am really pleased with you all – keep it up!
