


Strike Action on Tuesday 28th February

Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





It has been lovely to see so many happy and eager children returning to class after the half term holiday. This week our early years children have been very busy! In Little Lennie's we have read 'The Gingerbread Man' and in Reception, we have read the bible story 'The Feeding of the 5000.' These stories have supported scientific learning across the phases in looking at the changes that occur during the baking process. Our younger children have enjoyed baking Gingerbread Men and pancakes and our older children have enjoyed baking bread. We have developed our fine motor skills by painting gingerbread men and by designing, cutting, wrapping and sticking in order to make some boats. Some of us have spotted the bulbs that have started to grow in the pots outside and we are looking forward to developing our garden area as we approach Spring!

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







It has been lovely to welcome the children back to school this week and they have had a very busy four days! In English, we have enjoyed exploring the poem 'From a Railway Carriage' and worked together to collect new vocabulary to help describe different landscapes in preparation for creating our own version next week. We enjoyed learning about the Wright brothers in our history lessons and thought about why it was important for them to invent the first aeroplane. In PE, we developed our skills of sending and receiving where we made sure we focused on aiming carefully and using the correct amount of power to reach our target. We also started collecting data in our computing lessons by completing tally charts to help use count correctly. What a lot of learning! Well done on a super return to school KS1!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







The school week may have been a day shorter, but Lower Key Stage 2 needed the rest to pack everything into the last 4 days. We have been enthralled by the introduction of Ted Hughes' Iron Man as a giant mechanical creature crashes to Earth, only to be trapped and buried by the locals! All of our English skills have been called upon as we conclude our Escape from Pompeii writing. In Maths we have been comparing Mo Farah and Usain Bolt - converting distances between metres and kilometres and vice versa, plus continuing our efforts to reach 25 on the multiplication table check. We entered the season of Lent in church and began debating our new RE topic of why Easter is a time of mixed emotions. Science started with a review of our new-found knowledge about electricity and then we considered the functions of different parts of plants in the current unit. New learning in DT focussed on what makes a successful car as we aim to build our own chassis and sling-shot powered mechanisms over the coming weeks whilst PE displayed our innovation skills in creating our own game around sending and receiving. The week rounded off nicely with a GEM session to lift everyone's wellbeing! Keep being mindful and enjoy a well-earned weekend!

Year 5

We've had a super first week back in Year 5! All the adults were very proud of the children who read in church for our Ash Wednesday service — you did a fantastic job! In class, we have been very eager to start our new class novel, Cogheart, and during poetry week, we have read and compared different types of Norse poetry and considered the role of a skald in Viking life. Continuing our materials unit, we investigated different processes we can use to separate mixtures. In PE, we began our gymnastics unit, learning a variety of shape positions to use in sequences. Brass and Spanish lessons have continued and in RE, we linked the British Values to the big questions for the unit. In PSHE, we have started learning about Citizenship, considering the rules and laws in the UK.

Year 6

This week in Wrens, the children have produced some super poems as part of our poetry writing unit in English. In science, the children learned about the different groups of animals, and had a go at classifying animals based on a variety of different characteristics. As part of our RE, we were really lucky to have Reverend Tracy and Janet teaching our lesson which the children really enjoyed - this week we were exploring what God might be like and thinking about the design argument. The children have enjoyed our new class novel 'Wonder' and I have been impressed by their discussions around the text. Well done Wrens - a great start to the half term!
