

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





This week our early years children have been very busy learning all about Africa! In Little Lennie's we have read 'Handa's Hen' and in Blackbirds, we have read 'Anna Hibiscus's song.' These stories have supported Geography learning across the phase. Our younger children have located Africa on a map/globe and our older children have focused on the following climate zones: Rainforest, Savannah and the desert. We have enjoyed listening to and moving our bodies to traditional African music. We have enjoyed another fun-filled week in Key Stage 1! We were really lucky this week to have two visitors to school to enhance our learning. We thoroughly enjoyed our visiting author and found her stories very entertaining to listen to. We were also lucky to have the opportunity to grow our own carrots and learn about the life cycle of a carrot plant. In DT this week, we had the tricky task of making a prototype of our fairground wheel. It was a challenging activity, but we all persevered and tried our best. World book day was great fun and all three classes looked amazing in their wonderful costumes. It was lots of fun discussing our favourite books and trying to answer the questions on our World Book Day quiz! A super week everyone, well done!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







In Lower KS2 this week we have been all poetic with our new writing unit and a visit from Christina Gabbitas, performing her 'save us from plastic' rap alongside talking to us about her experience as an author and using music to enliven reading. For PE, we practised sending and receiving skills with tactical decisions in our own variations of dodgeball and netball with some of us even representing school as ambassadors in the glow dodgeball tournament. Historical enquiry focussed on our locality, researching why St Leonard's Chapel was listed and protected as a significant building. We had a 'wheely' good time with DT, creating the frame for our slingshot car chassis. Other notable highlights have been in computing, where we designed and coded a musical instrument using the Scratch software, and rounding off the week with our artistic character designs for World Book Day based on the 'Iron Man'. Year 5

We have had another great week in Year 5, filled with super learning. The children wrote some brilliant Norse poetry, casting spells to protect warriors in adventure and battle. We started our Vikings unit in history and the children analysed sources teaching us about the Lindisfarne Raid and discussed their reliability as historical evidence. In PE, the children created and performed sequences using a variety of gymnastic positions before learning a variety of balances – we have some skilled gymnasts amongst us! We continued to explore databases in computing, this week learning how to sort data by field. Both classes sounded fantastic during their brass lessons, learning a range of different songs and genres to perform. In RE, we started a new unit of learning and discussed what we mean by 'victory' while considering different victories through history. Well done Year 5 – keep up the great work!

Year 6

This week, the children have been working very hard as usual. On Tuesday, the children enjoyed the visit of the author Christina Gabbitas who kindly gave them a copy of her comic strip book to read and take home. They also enjoyed looking at the Mayan artefacts on loan from the Lancashire museum service - we had good fun examining the objects and deciding what they were. We enjoyed another RE lesson from Reverend Tracy which was again most thought provoking. In Science the children learned about classification keys and created their own. We are continuing to enjoy our class novel - 'Wonder', and rounded the week off with a super PE lesson. Well done Wrens!
