


### **Year 5 Brass Concert**

### **Weekly Highlights**

### Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





This week our early years children have been very busy learning all about the ocean. In Little Lennie's we have read 'Rainbow Fish' and in Blackbirds, we have read 'Tiddler.' Our younger children have used non-fiction books and the internet to find out about what lives in the sea whilst our older children have been learning some facts about the different life forms under the sea. Both classes have been thinking hard about our pupil promises. Little Lennies have explored our yellow pupil promise; being kind and looking after others, this involved talking about what makes a good friend. Blackbirds have explored our green pupil promise; being honest and respectful. Little Lennies have used their fine motor skills to make under the sea creations, these involved weaving, cutting and mixing different colours of paint. Maths learning in Blackbirds has been 3d shapes and clocks, we have looked at the hour hand. The children in Blackbirds have loved their bike ability sessions; it has been wonderful to see the progress in their skills across the three days. Many discussions about Spring in both classes. Another marvellous week of learning!

### Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







Key Stage have worked incredibly hard all week and we are all proud of each and every one of them. This week we have continued to read Major Glad, Major Dizzy as part of our English lessons and we enjoyed making our own peg doll before we wrote a set of instructions to explain how we did it. In History, we started to learn about the history of the train and discovered what happened during the Rainhill Trials in the 1800s. In RE, we enjoyed the opportunity to learn outside as we created beautiful Easter gardens using natural materials to show our understanding of the Easter story. Well done everyone!

### Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







In our penultimate week of this term, LKS2 classes have enjoyed meeting the main sassy, sarcastic character Tuffy in our new novel 'Diary of a Killer Cat' far too much! With a sense of community, we have been composing a campaign to save local 'at risk' buildings, writing persuasive letters, designing posters and creating adverts with symbolic mascots. Kingball – a mix of benchball with dodgeball - was a hugely entertaining way to demonstrate finding space to send and receive passes in PE and our slingshot cars are being prepared for testing, having joined and cladded the exteriors. With the Y3/4 Let's Go Sing event at King George's Hall next Monday, we have been putting the final finishing flourishes to our performance. To end the week, following the equinox and arrival of Spring (fingerscrossed), we demonstrated the 'growth' in our knowledge with some impressive assessments. ### Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts & Wrens







#### Year 5

Year 5 have worked incredibly hard this week. We started with history afternoons, discussing whether King Alfred really was 'Great' and using historical evidence to learn more about how the Vikings lived. The children did a great job of evaluating the usefulness of the evidence, wondering whether it told us about all Vikings. In PE, the children created solo sequences using equipment and incorporating different mounts and dismounts, styles of travelling, jumps, balances and rolls. In Computing, we used the AND and OR search functions to find information using a database and on Thursday afternoon, the children rehearsed together as a year group for the upcoming concert. In RE, children have been retelling the Easter story, focusing on how Jesus' death and resurrection was a victory for Christians. To complete the week, we have been inspired by pressure groups who aim to improve the world around us! Keep up the super effort!

#### Year 6

This week in Wrens started with a real treat: a visit from Bishop Philip. We were really lucky that Bishop Philip took time out of his busy schedule to spend time teaching the children all about the Eucharist. In History, the children learned about Mayan Technology and discussed which aspects were the most important. In science, we are still waiting to see what develops in our bread experiment and so in the meantime, the children learned about micro-organisms and the effects that they can have on us. In English, we have started a short writing unit based on the animation 'Alma' - it has certainly captured the children's imaginations. Some of the children met with parishoners at the the Lent lunch and once again represented Year 6 and our school superbly. Well done Wrens - keep working hard!
