Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



What a fabulous week we have had in KS1 this week! We have continued to enjoy our English sessions where we have role-played and hot-seated in the character of the last wolf. In Science, we have planted our very own sunflower seeds and have created our very own sunflower diary. We spent time outside hunting for all of the wildflowers we have been learning about. In Geography, we explored what it is like to live in Asia and all of the famous architecture and history! We have had a fantastic time in Art this week learning how to weave in order to create a pattern. Well done Key Stage 1!

What a fantastic week we have had in Year 3 and 4! In Science, we have started to learn about teeth and digestion. We worked scientifically to investigate whether or not sugary drinks affect the enamel on our teeth, using an egg, water and a sugary drink. We are very excited to observe what happens to the egg (enamel) over time! In PE, we have continued to learn about running techniques and in Art, we have focused on another image where an artist has used different techniques to tell a story. We are also becoming very fluent with our Spanish speaking and writing, when learning and practising the days of the week. Well done for another super week everybody!

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts & Wrens



Year 5

Year 5 have been busy this week (as usual). In PE, they continued reflecting on their experience of different games, like dodgeball and bench ball, to understand what strategies and tactics are used to help them and their team. Art gave the children a chance to design a discovery centre for a zoo based on the style and work of Morag Myerscough. They enjoyed listening to the local author, Brian Beresford, and finding out about his recently published book. RE (which will be mainly about St. Paul and the early life of the Church) started with the Acts of the Apostles and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. After checking how much of our last Science unit children could remember, we started a new unit with different ways plants are able to reproduce and the benefits and drawbacks of both methods. All in all, a busy week with lots going on.

Year 6

Wrens have had another busy week and have been working very hard. We continued our work looking at the geography of our local area and compared old and modern maps and photographs of Langho; the children enjoyed spotting the differences over time. In Science, the children considered the different properties of materials and their uses in everyday objects. We were lucky to have two visits this week - on Tuesday we had a visit from the author Brian Beresford who spoke about his book 'The Midnight Grocer' and taught the children a song to go with it. On Thursday, Mr Ghani, one of our parents, kindly came to speak to the children about Eid which they found very interesting. The week was rounded off with another super PE lesson with Mr Kirkham. Well done Wrens - you are all working really hard, and we are so pleased with you all.
