

We will be inviting St. Mary's Roman Catholic Primary School to take part too. You can get started straight away!

The method

- 1. Write down or sketch some ideas as to how you will construct the chair.
- 2. When you are planning, think about using cones, interlocking sheets, spirals, tubes or even using strips of card like sewing thread.
- 3. Use the materials to create a chair made from cardboard.
- 4. If your first design doesn't work, evaluate what went wrong and try again.



Absence during term time

We have had a huge increase in the number of Leave of Absence requests for holidays during term time. Please do everything you can to avoid taking children out of school as this comes at a cost to your child's education. Please see our attendance policy on the website for information regarding penalty notices which may be issued if a pupil has had 5 school days (10 sessions) lost to unauthorised absence during the current term or 7 school days (14 sessions) in 2 consecutive terms. A holiday form must also be completed at least 2 weeks prior to the start of the absence to avoid a penalty notice being issued.

During the Spring Term, a total of **607.5 days** of school was missed by children for different reasons.

Please avoid holidays and planned appointments in term time - days off soon add up to a lot of missed learning

Morning Drop Off - Support for parents/carers in keeping children safe before school begins.

There is a ten minute window to allow children to be ready in school for an 8.55 start. School gates are open at **8.45am.** Please try not to bring your child earlier than this. If you do arrive too early, please form an orderly queue on the pavement and supervise your children so they do not congregate in a huddle.

Gates are locked at 8.55am and anyone arriving after this time needs to go through the main office.

Please be reminded that parents/carers are responsible for the safety of their own children until 8.45am when the children enter the school grounds and go straight into the building.

The crossing patrol operates outside of the Church entrance. For anyone parking on the top car park at Mytton Fold, there are paths towards the hotel reception and the main road leading safely to the crossing patrol.

May we also ask that adults leave their children to walk down the path on their own, unless your child really needs to be accompanied.

School dinners - price increase from September 2023

School lunch prices will increase by 10p to £2.40 per child per day from September 2023. The cost remains less than the recommended local authority price of school lunches.

Mandy's school meals are healthy, nutritious and tasty and we can be flexible with accommodating the needs of families who wish to have a school meal on some rather than every day of the week.

Little Lennie's - price increase from September 2023

In line with our local authority, the hourly cost of our Little Lennie's pre-school will increase to £4.75 per hour from September 2023. Our prices have remained the same since the opening of Little Lennie's despite a cost increase advised by the local authority which should have taken effect during the summer term of last year.

The Year 2's this week have shown a fantastic attitude with great perseverance toward completing their SATs. This week we have continued to read The Last Wolf as part of our English lessons, and we enjoyed writing our own letters to Mrs Lindley to help the animals in our own woods. In Geography, we started to learn about the migration of swallows and discovered what famous landmarks they would have seen when flying across countries and continents. In Science, we have continued our investigation on how well cress can be grown in different environments. Well done everyone!

What an incredible week we have had in Year 3 and 4! In Geography, we concluded our topic about earthquakes and volcanoes by constructing our very own erupting volcano using vinegar, red food-colouring and bicarbonate soda. How exciting! The children also had the opportunity to learn about and research some recent eruptions and earthquakes. In PE, we have been focusing on throwing techniques and aiming for a target. The children worked extremely hard in mastering their throw and 'pushing' the ball out into the air. In RE this week, we thought about the similarities and differences between Churches and Mosques by virtually exploring inside these different places of worship. We were even lucky enough to learn some extra information from our more knowledgeable children. Well done for another fantastic week, everyone!

Year 5

With Monday not being a bank holiday (for a change), Year 5 were pleased to be doing a bit more art, which involved collaborating to complete a design for a zoo's discovery centre. They also got their extra PE lesson - two this week - identifying tactics and strategies in team noughts and crosses, and cops and robbers. Their RE work was about the spread of christianity and the persecution of early Christians. In maths, the children finished their work on decimals (but find some games to play on maths playground or top marks if you want to boost your confidence) and began a new unit on shape and angles. We also finished our geography work with the life story of an item of food or clothing, from the climate where they grew, through the transport and processes it too for them to arrive at our house (along with who or what they met along the way).

Many of the children are enjoying their brass lessons and practising set pieces ready for an end of term concert. Some are not taking their instruments home to practise. Please can you encourage them to keep practising a few times a week so they feel more confident and are able to produce a more refined tune for their performance.
