

Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



This week in early years we have been learning all about winter. Both Nursery and Reception children have read stories with the same title but by different authors - 'One Snowy Night.' In Nursery our children have been thinking about how we can keep ourselves warm in winter. They have been exploring materials and describing how they feel, thinking about the best kinds of clothes to wear during the colder season. In Reception our children have been thinking about why it is cooler during winter and what happens to water when it is cold. They have been using ramps and learning about angles, linking this to the sun and the earth during winter - shorter days and also exploring freezing and melting. A lot of learning which builds future scientific foundations. Well done everyone! ☺

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



This week KS1 have done some brilliant planning, writing and editing for their own versions of 'The Lion Inside'. They have worked hard to remember all their punctuation and Year 2 have included brilliant noun phrases. The children have continued with their dance routines in PE, again working hard to refine and improve their movements. In History, the children learnt about Samuel Pepys' diary from the Great Fire of London. In Science, Y1 learnt about transparent and opaque materials whilst Y2 were detectives, identifying which material objects were made from. Well done on a super week of learning everyone!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



This week, the children have enjoyed writing their own narrative stories based on the Stone Age. We have seen some wonderful creativity in these, and they really showcase the children's fantastic learning. In PE, the children have been practising a dance routine to a popular song. There have been some amazing dancers showing off their skills! In science, we have been learning all about the classification of animals, and the children have created their own classification keys for different animals. In art, we have been practising our shading techniques, being sure to follow the 4 rules of shading. Well done on another fantastic week of learning everybody!

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts, Wagtails & Wrens



Year 5

Year 5 children have had a brilliant week and have impressed adults by learning the Pupil Promises and showing understanding of what makes good behaviour for learning. In English, the children have been writing their own Norse myths based on 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' and we have read some excellent work! In Science, we learned what it meant if a change was 'reversible' and considered some reversible changes that we see in everyday life. In RE, we read the Parable of the Mustard Seed and the Parable of the Yeast and understood the impact that Jesus' teachings have on us today. In History, we investigated what happened to the Maya city-states leading to the demise of the Mayan civilisation. In Spanish, we have learned how to say 10 parts of a house and articulate which rooms we do and don't have. Fantastic work!

Year 6

This week, in year 6 we have learned all about the heart and how it works - children were fascinated to listen to various different heartbeats and detect the different rhythms. In history, we learned all about King Charles II, the Merry Monarch and the legacy that he left behind - and some of the turbulent events during his reign. The children were also very interested to hear all about the Eucharist from Reverend Ness - we are very grateful that she gave her time so freely. Well done year 6 !!
