



Next Friday 8th March - International Women's Day 2024



Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





Little Lennies have been asking the questions: What lives in the sea? and How do fish live under water? Thinking about how fish breathe with gills and how they move with their fins. They have been getting creative, looking at different seascape paintings, mixing white and blue to make different tints and using their paintbrushes in ways to create both calm and stormy seas.

Blackbirds have been focussing on shipwrecks and exploring how the ocean can tell us stories - particularly about the past. They have been learning about the Titanic - finding out facts and discussing what made it sink. Blackbirds have explored GoogleMaps, locating different oceans around the world and finding out about the interesting creatures which live there.

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







This week, KS1 have been very excited about designing their puppet for their design Technology project. In RE, they listened to the story of Holy Week to understand more of the symbols we get from the Bible. They have practised different ways of helping them to send and receive in PE and been looking at money, spending and saving in PSHE. Some have shown they are very practised at grouping objects as an easy way of counting and relating this to some of the processes computers are programmed to do. Geography was all about he Equator as an invisible line that separates the two hemispheres. We finished the week with Science, where some were identifying wild flowers and other moved from their knowledge of seeds last week to bulbs this week. What a busy week it has been! Thanks to all those who have shown great efforts in their learning.

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







This week in LKS2 we have been discussing characters' motives and the consequences of their actions during Whole Class Guided Reading, using our exciting text, The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. We have also focussed on giving full explanations as well as a variety of other question types. In English we are thoroughly enjoying learning about whales for our information Article. We have been practising grammar skills needed for this genre and we have used similes to create super poetry about a whale. In DT we introduced Smart Wearables to the children and analysed the WAYV harness. We looked at BBC Micro:bit coding website that can be used for Smart Wearables. Our investigations in Science led us to ask the question, 'Do all plants need the same things to survive?' We considered different environments alongside the characteristics of living things. In Geography we learned about UK counties and cities and in RE we looked at stories from the New Testament where Jesus' Disciples showed trust in Him. We considered times when Jesus put His trust in His Disciples.

What a fun but challenging week of learning!

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts, Wagtails & Wrens









Year 5

We have enjoyed another fun-filled week in Year 5. In Spanish, we thoroughly enjoyed reading and listening to Goldilocks and the Three Bears, where we were able to learn even more new words. In Science, we continued looking at the human timeline, specifically at how human bodies develop as we mature. In RE, we learnt about how Jesus' death and resurrection are a celebrated victory for Christians . Robins loved their second swimming lesson and Swifts enjoyed their Key PE session at the end of the week. Well done everybody!

Year 6

Year 6 have had another busy week! We have enjoyed reading more of our class novel 'Wonder' and the children have been working hard to answer some tricky inference questions. In writing lessons, we have found out more about the Galapagos Islands and have started to plan our explanation report based on the book. In science - the children had great fun discovering the sugar content of various drinks and finding out which were the healthiest. In RE the children were interested to find out about the easter traditions of Mexico and Ethiopia. In Geography, we have learned about tectonic plates in readiness for our work on Earthquakes next week. A very hard working week - well done everyone!
